

Ladino Clover

Ladino clovers are a large leafed variety of white clovers that typically persist for several years. They are appealing to both livestock and wildlife. Ladino clover tends to be quite shade tolerant, allowing it to thrive in field borders and other shady areas.

Ladino clover can be a challenge to dry down, so it is not recommended to use it for hay fields, but instead utilize it in pastures and wildlife areas.

Some species (horses especially) are not well-suited to white clover.

Ladino clover is available as raw seed or as Ladino ctd (which contains a coating and inoculant).



Seeding Method:	Frost seed, drill, broadcast
Seeding Rate:	6-8# full stand, 1-3# for mixes & overseeding
Seeding Depth:	1/4"
Seeding Dates:	Seeding Dates: 2/15 - 5/1 or 8/15 - 9/20
Notes:	Ladino can be hard to dry down. Can cause bloat, manage appropriately. Use inoculant to maximize nitrogen fixation.
